He was passionate about art and was a very talented painter. He had various jobs after the military and even took a few classes in college for art before going to a trade school to become a pipe fitter, where he became an expert in the field. Bo was a respected member of our family. His children, and all the nieces and nephews, looked up to him as he liked to sit back and tell his stories, of which there were many.
