Barry G. Jordan, Sr. 68, was a native of Norfolk, Virginia. He was born to the late Joseph Jordan and Ida Mae Jordan Diggs. Barry was a graduate of Lake Taylor High School. He attended Norfolk State College (now University), where he met his future wife, Gloria.

While in the Air Force, Barry received an Associate of Arts Degree from Saint Leo College: Saint Leo, Florida, a Bachelor of Science Degree from Longwood College (now University) in Farmville, Virginia and a MASTER OF PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION DEGREE from Troy State University, (now Troy University) in Alabama. Barry was a formal member of the American Society of Radiologic Technologists. He became a Nuclear Medicine Technologist. After 40 years of loyal service with the American Federal Government, he retired.
