



Brett Vonré Harrell Sr.

November 14, 1968 - August 2, 2023

Brett Vonré Harrell Sr. transitioned to glory on Wednesday, August 2, 2023. He was born on November 14, 1968 to the late John and Janita Harrell.

Brett grew up in Victory Gardens, now known as Cavalier Manor in Portsmouth, Virginia. He graduated from I. C. Norcom Highschool where he was member of the “Marching Greyhounds” Drum Line. He continued on to graduate from Norfolk State University with a Bachelor of Music with an emphasis in media. He was a member of the NSU Jazz Trio also known as “The Power Trio”. At NSU, Brett served as the section leader for the “Million Dollar Funk Squad” in “The Marching Spartan Legion”. He was also a member of the marching band fraternity Phi Mu Alpha.

Brett joined Mount Calvary Baptist Church at the age of 15 and continued to serve and worship there the remainder of his life. He served their Music Ministry as the Choir Director, Keyboardist, and most currently the Bass Player.

Brett’s phenomenal professional career began in the public school system. He was the music teacher at Sheep Harney Elementary School, served as the Bass player for the Heritage Highschool Flashback R&B shows, and as the Band Director for Sussex County Highschool.

Brett was known and loved throughout the entertainment industry as “Bam Bam” Harrell. He was the drummer for the Boogie Band at Busch Gardens Amusement Park. But he was best known as a professional bassist. He performed with several bands including Kustom Made, Phenomenal Sounds, the Unifics, A Touch of Spice, As 1, the Champagne Band, and the Opium Band. He played for many well-known events such as the Hampton Jazz Festival and the Ebony Fashion Fair Showcase. His talents allowed him to share the stage with many entertainers such as The Gap Band, Glen Jones, Charlie Wilson, and Gregory Porter.

Brett was predeceased by his brother Reginald Harrell, sister Brenda Myers, and nephew Tarrell Harrell. He is survived by his son Brett Vonré Harrell Jr., his two daughters Bria Janaé Marcelle Harrell and Jaia T’Keyah Johnson, as well as his brother Allen Harrell, sister JoAnn, Ward, and fiancé Christina C. Gardner.

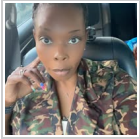
