



Carlton Slaughter

November 30, 1955 - March 3, 2015

Carlton A. Slaughter, 59, passed away on Tuesday, March 3, 2015. He was the eldest child of James A. Slaughter (deceased) and Eula B. Slaughter of Portsmouth, Virginia. In addition to his mother he is survived by his siblings, Ms. Karen D. Woods of Norfolk, Virginia, Mr. Kevin R. Slaughter of Woodbridge, Virginia and Mr. Ken L. Slaughter of Suffolk, Virginia as well as his children, Ms. Veronica Slaughter and Carlton A. Slaughter, Jr., Tyrone and LaMonica Weaver of Wichita Falls, Texas. Carlton's children blessed him with multiple grandchildren and great grandchildren: Quentin Slaughter, Tamarah Slaughter, Nicholas Slaughter, Warren Hunter, Jr., Maurice Hunter, Brianna Hunter (Veronica), LaDarrius Weaver, Tyllejah Weaver (Tyrone), and Jayvon Weaver, Cary Rogans II (LaMonica). His nephew, Wynton M. Woods and nieces Cytina W. Chavis (Woods) and Sydney N. Slaughter are left to cherish his memory as well as a host of cousins. Carlton was born on November 30th, 1955 at Maryview Hospital in Portsmouth, Virginia. An excellent student throughout his school age years, he attended I. C. Norcom High graduating in June of 1974 with a diploma in Industrial Arts & Design. During his teenage years, Mr. George Cotton, encouraged Carlton's love of music and taught him to play the guitar. With childhood friend Clarence Southall and others, Carlton would form their own band, The People's Choice and go on to perform professionally. Following graduation from high school, he would serve his country as a member of the United States Army. While stationed at Fort Sill in Lawton, Oklahoma, where he served as the Assistant 2nd Platoon Sergeant

for the First Battalion, E Battery, Carlton would meet and marry Ms. Clara Weaver. He would later do a tour of duty in Germany, followed by a tour at Fort Bliss in El Paso, Texas until 1986 when he was honorably discharged as a sergeant. Carlton would reside in El Paso until returning to his hometown in 1996, ironically, moving into the house next door to his family home..Carlton's skills as a trained automotive mechanic acquired during his time in Army transportation, allowed him to work with multiple firms in the Tidewater area as well as pursue his goals as an independent business operator. In fact, he was at work on a family friend's car when he was stricken.Carlton loved classic movies and television, especially Western dramas. He could often be found at home relaxing while watching his Gunsmoke collection. He had a great sense of humor and comforting laugh. Carlton was cherished by his family and friends. We will always remember him and the joy he brought to our lives.

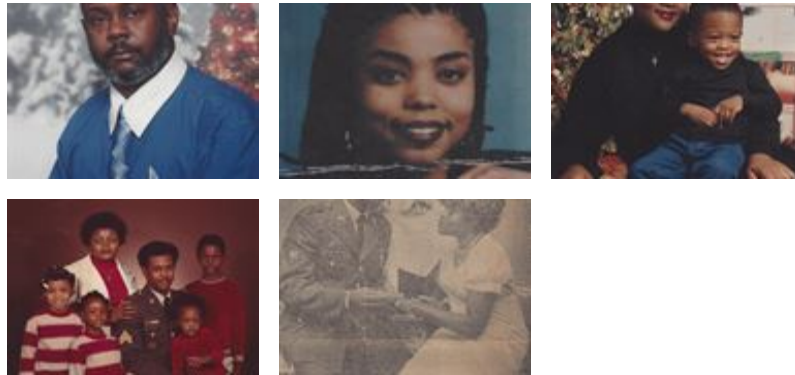
