



Dorothy Lee-Calloway

November 3, 1929 - September 19, 2015

Mrs. Dorothy Calloway transitioned to be with the Lord in Chesapeake, Virginia on September 19, 2015, after a long and valiant battle with illness. Dorothy was the third daughter of eight children from the union of Nathaniel Ivan Lee and Harriet Elizabeth Lewis who both predeceased her. Dorothy was born on November 3, 1929 in Costa Rica and relocated with her parents to the island nation of Jamaica while still an infant. After finishing high school and attending college in Jamaica, Dorothy migrated to the United States to be with her father in Brooklyn, New York. She soon discovered a passion for helping people and studied to become a nurse at Hunter College where she received her Associate degree for Nursing. Dorothy then sought employment as a Licensed Practical Nurse and was well received at Bellevue Hospital in Manhattan, New York. In 1959 the beautiful Dorothy met the dapper Calvin Calloway while they both worked at Bellevue Hospital. The two were married on May 13, 1961 and from this union came their only child, Brian. Dorothy continued to study at Hunter College and became a Registered Nurse in 1971. Dorothy worked at Bellevue Hospital in the Intensive Care Unit and the Ambulatory Surgery Unit as a Head Nurse until her retirement in 1996. Dorothy is survived by her son Brian Calloway, daughter Veronica Davis (from a previous relationship), daughter-in-law Beatrice Wilson- Calloway, grandchildren Calvin Calloway, Andre' Wilson-Calloway, Stephanie Davis-Mckoy, Eric Davis and Aasim Carrington; Brother Phillip Lee, Sister-in-Law Susan Lee; Brother Gerald Lee and Sister-in Law Althea Lee; Sister Valrie
