January 27, 1945 - March 23, 2020

Dr. Jack B. Gaines Sr., 75, of Chesapeake, VA transitioned to eternal glory in the early morning hours of March 23, 2020. Jack was a humble man. In his early years, Jack became one of the first African American pitchers in Major League Baseball. In his later years, Jack dedicated his life by serving in the ministry as an Assistant Pastor, Missions Elder and as an Ambassador for Global Reconciliation.

To honor his legacy are his wife of 51 years, Mildred, Jack Jr. (Son), Joy Gaines Ransom (Daughter), Jerrold (Son), Jayda and Daurielle Ransom (Granddaughters), Gifted Children, Ineeta Harris and Perrerr Tosso, Sisters, Janice Forrest and Jacqueline Pope (Nathaniel), Brother, Jeremiah Gaines Jr. (Theresa) and a host of nieces, nephews and cousins.

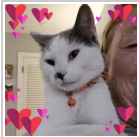

“When Tom Rees and I waited for Jack Gaines at the Houston airport terminal, I didn't know him. Several years earlier, I had Googled racial reconciliation and found Jack's book, *My Brother's Keeper Not My Brother's Killer*, and read excerpts from it.

When a dark-skinned man stepped out of the terminal, Tom said, “Well here's Jack.”

As I looked at the man headed our way, the Holy Spirit said: “Listen to everything that this man says.”

That moved my thoughts into a new gear. I understood that I was about to meet one of God's chosen. Mentally, I moved from mild anticipation to the very edge of my seat.

From that point on, when Jack spoke I noted a couple of things: he stuck to the Word of God, and he said what God had given him to say. He didn't freelance much into what God had given others but focused very much on what God had given him.

And Jack spoke with depth, which is where you find real truth, real meaning, real motivations.

Jack Gaines was a wonderful man, an inspiration past and an inspiration present to me. I think of him with a great deal of warmth. I have wondered how I can feel brotherly to a man I have only known a few years?

Must be God.

I'll conclude with this. Once during a Reconciliation Eagles webinar, the Holy Spirit referred to Jack, and the rest of the Eagles with high praise, “. . . of whom the world was not worthy”.

When He said that (NKJ, Hebrews 11:38), I knew I was among high-quality citizens of heaven on the earth.

Jack was indeed a citizen of heaven on the earth. He was a great man. And I miss him deeply.
