



Feral Graham McCall Sr.

With hearts full of love and gratitude, we celebrate the remarkable life of Feral Graham “Mack” McCall, a devoted husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, veteran, and friend. Born in Hartsville, South Carolina, Feral's journey was of resilience, dedication, and unwavering love for his family and country.

At a young age, he moved to Washington, D.C., with his mother and adopted father, Anderson McCall. After the passing of his beloved mother, Annie Eliza Graham, when he was 17 years old, he lived with his uncles until he joined the military. He pursued his education with determination, earning his GED in the Navy and later attending Tidewater Community College.

Feral dedicated 20 years of honorable service to the United States Navy, rising to the rank of E-5 and receiving numerous commendations, including the National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal with Bronze Star, Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal, and Meritorious Unit Commendation. He proudly served aboard several ships, including the USS Randolph, USS Valley Forge, USS Franklin D. Roosevelt, and USS Independence, leaving an indelible mark through his service and leadership.

Following his military career, Feral worked ten years at the Norfolk Naval Shipyard, leading his crew as a skilled toolsman until an injury forced him into

early retirement in 1990. His dedication to hard work and craftsmanship was evident in everything he did.

Beyond his career, Feral was a man of simple joys and deep passions. He loved fishing, playing pool, and listening to jazz. A devoted football fan, he could often be found cheering for his team or impressing family and friends with his knowledge of Jeopardy!—rarely missing a question. He cherished family cookouts, always manning the grill, and found immense joy in the company of his loved ones. National Geographic was a favorite companion, feeding his ever-curious mind.

Feral's greatest love was his family. He met his wife, Mary Virginia Dancy, in a Portsmouth restaurant, and from the moment he saw her, he knew she would be his wife. They married on June 20, 1957, and together they built a home filled with love and laughter. Though he endured the heartbreaking loss of his beloved Mary and their sons, Feral Jr. and Mark David, he remained a pillar of strength for those left behind.

He is survived by his devoted daughter, Fleicia Bullock; cherished grandchildren, Monica Hines (Robert), Ernest Donnell Bullock Jr., and Allen Bailey Jr. (God-grandson); and his three precious great-grandchildren, Diamond, Gabriella, and Nathaniel Hines. Nieces, nephews, and other relatives further survive Feral.

Feral Graham McCall was a man of honor, wisdom, and warmth. His legacy of love, service, and perseverance will live on in the hearts of those who knew him. Though he has set sail on his final voyage, his spirit remains ever present in the love he shared and the lives he touched.
