Henry Clay Spellman fell asleep peacefully in death at Coney Island Hospital in Brooklyn, NY. Henry was born to the late William Henry Spellman and Onella (Green) Spellman in Elizabeth City, North Carolina.

Henry was preceded in death by his wife - Willie Mae Spellman, his brother - John Henry Spellman and his sister - Shirley Spellman. He is survived by 2 sons; Keith Spellman (Leeshur) of Brooklyn, NY and Lorenzo Spellman of Franklin Park, NJ; a brother; William Henry Spellman, 2 grandchildren; Eliadia Spellman, Mechal Spellman and a great-grandson, Dashaun Spellman; as well as a host of nephews, nieces and cousins. His interests included bible reading, giving bible lectures, officiating wedding ceremonies, traveling, talking for hours with his family on the phone and eating southern cuisine especially "smoked" sausages. Despite a decline in

health, Henry took comfort in the words at Hebrew 6:10 which says "God is not unrighteous, so as to forget your work, for He is my Father, my God, my Friend". He wanted us to continue exerting ourselves with helping others learn about Jehovah and staying close to Jehovah as we live in critical times. As many know, He left clear instructions for us to remember him but not to spend time mourning his death because we will be reunited with him in paradise.
