James Vernon Stancil, Jr, 66, departed this life on Saturday, August 31, 2024. He was born the 1st of 3 children on October 13, 1957 to the late James V. Stancil, Sr. and the late Louise Rowser Stancil in Demopolis, AL.

He attended Denbigh High School in Newport News, VA and graduated with his diploma in 1976. Upon graduating from high school he enlisted in the U.S. Army where he was stationed in Phoenix, AZ. Following his career in the military he relocated to Chicago, IL.

James was an avid learner and advocate for higher education. While in Chicago he enrolled in several higher education programs. He attended and graduated from a local Barber school and became a Licensed Professional Barber. James also enrolled in classes at Harold Washington College and later attended and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in History from Chicago State University in 1992. While enrolled at Chicago State University he held leadership positions as an editor and publisher for the school newspaper and as the President of the student government association.

In addition to fulfilling a rewarding career as a very skilled Licensed Professional Barber for over 30 years, James also held professional positions working for several organizations including the United Food and Commercial Workers Union and Newport News Public Schools. He also served his

community by working with the local NAACP chapter and by faithfully attending city council and schoolboard meetings. He showed his personal commitment to educational and economic development for the youth and for the overall Black community by making formal proposals to city government officials and by making his voice heard on behalf of his community.

James is preceded in death by his parents James V. Stancil, Sr. and Louise Rowser Stancil.

He leaves to cherish his memories two sons, Pierre Stancil and Malik Stancil; two sisters, Gail Burris (Robert, Jr.) and Karen Stancil Tribbey; one aunt, Elsie Rowser Thomas; two grandchildren, Laila Stancil and Cameryn Stancil; and a host of nieces, nephews, relatives, and friends.
