



Josiah Hamilton, Sr.

June 18, 1932 - June 22, 2011

Portsmouth-Josiah Hamilton, Sr., known as “Blue” by his childhood family and friends, 78, of the 1300 block of Stratford Street, was called home to be with the Lord on Wednesday, June 22, 2011. He was born on July 27, 1932 in Suffolk, VA and was the son of the late Victoria Bolling but was reared by Harrison and Annie Hamilton. His early education began at Poplar Run Elementary School and he received his diploma from East Suffolk High School. Josiah received a two year certificate in Masonry from Norfolk State College in 1962. After serving four years in the United States Army, Josiah returned home and started a career with the Federal Government in 1953. He worked as a supervisor at the Norfolk Naval Air Station for 42 years and retired in 1995. Josiah has been a part of Poplar Run Baptist Church all of his life and served as a Deacon the last twenty three years. After he retired, much of his time was spent at the church. He was at the church almost daily until his health began to fail. Rev. Williams had only to say he was needed, day or night and he was on his way, sometimes staying several hours at a time. He was a member of the Pastor’s aide Club, Missionary Society and Sunday School. Josiah loved Vacation Bible School and Family and Friends Day was his passion. He served as Vice-Chairman of the Deacon Board and was church treasurer for twenty one years. There was no job too large or too small for him.

Left to cherish his memories is his loving wife, Joyce B. Hamilton; two sons,
