I just learned of Leon's passing. My heart sank. I first met Leon while attending Austin Peay University in Clarksville Tn. Leon was stationed at Fort Campbell Kentucky. We became really good friends, Leon got to know my family and I got to know his family by all the stories he told about his childhood. He told me he was adopted. Leon often spoke of his mother; he loved and adored his mother. I moved to Tx, and Leon got station overseas. We lost contact. But I often wondered how he was doing.

My mother was a great cook, I was raised with five brothers, needless to say Sunday dinners were always massive and a chore to say the least. My mother would say, I'm sure Leon might like a hot meal, call Leon and invite him and his friends to dinner.
