Marvin Earl Clark, 61, of Waldorf, Maryland peacefully passed away on April 13, 2012. Marvin was the beloved son of Rena Clark Cannon and the late Christopher Clark, Sr. and step-father, George Cannon. He was preceded in death by his brother, Steve Clark. Marvin graduated from I.C. Norcom High School in 1966 and was known as “Bo Earl” by close friends and classmates. After graduating from high school, he was drafted into the U. S. Army serving two tours in Vietnam. After the military, Marvin had a lustrous career in the Federal Government performing a variety of positions at the Norfolk Naval Shipyard, Naval Weapons Station in Seal Beach, California and Naval Research Laboratory in Washington, DC where he retired on November 3, 2011 after 39 years of service. Marvin had a special relationship with his father-in-law, James Turner that will always be remembered and cherished. Marvin enjoyed the laughs and talks they had over the years. He enjoyed the stories told by his father-in-law about his truck driving days and his experiences in life.
