



Otis Cannon Jr.

August 21, 1950 - August 16, 2015

In a small rural community of Carrollton, Virginia, Otis Columbus Cannon, Jr. was the youngest of 3 children born to the late Otis and Nellie Cannon. Young Otis helped his parents on their farm and graduated from Westside High School in Smithfield, Virginia; where he participated in ROTC and had several roles in school plays.

After graduating from Westside High School he enrolled in Norfolk State University, and earned a B.S. degree in Psychology. He continued his education and earned an MSW in Social Work at NSU as well. He took a Social Work Class on Marriage and the Family" and that's when his life really became exciting. A young lady (Brenda), from beautiful Portsmouth, caught his eye. While attending NSU, Otis worked as a counselor at Norfolk Psychiatric Center. Brenda submitted an application for employment there, but instead of being interviewed and hired by Otis, he called and asked her out on a date. Eighteen months later, they were married on October 14, 1978 at Mt. Calvary Baptist Church, with an elegant candlelight wedding. All were in awe, when he walked down the aisle to the song "Inseparable". Yes, inseparable was what they were for 37 years. Otis often bragged that he upgraded Brenda from a rabbit jacket to a mink coat. (smile)

Otis later became an EAP Coordinator with Maryview Bon Secours; counseling clients, providing guidance and training to various companies in

the community- this he absolutely loved! And, as an Adjunct Professor at NSU, he was known for his, "tell it like it is" style of communicating. He loved teaching! Both afforded him the opportunity to look good every day.

In 1985, he became the proud dad of a baby girl, Lauren. He worked evenings when Lauren was a baby and the two of them spent days together going to the beach, shopping, doing arts and crafts and neglecting to do anything on his honey do list. Their bond was very strong. Otis was the best cheerleading dad, pageant dad, math tutor, cab driver and seamstress. He gracefully accepted the role of surrogate father to his niece, Jessica and bravely taught her to drive as well as coached her through college.

Otis was an extraordinary caregiver. He cared for his father, Otis Cannon, Sr. and his mother-in-law, Mary A. Williams.

He was preceded in death by his three siblings, Gloria, Ernestine and Nathaniel Cannon.

He will be truly missed by his wife, daughter, aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, other relatives, colleagues, students, friends, his granddog "Bayla", neighbors and church members - T.J Maxx and Home Depot will greatly miss him too.

The image of him cruising in his convertible around town, looking oh-so-good, every hair in place, with the style of an impeccably-dressed gentlemen, loving husband, gentle dad, faithful Christian, awesome cook, entertainer, horticulturist, interior decorator and the creator of Christmas magic for us were just a few things that assisted Otis C. Cannon in living a life "well lived".
