



Sylvia Porter Harrison

July 14, 1938 - January 13, 2018

Sylvia Porter Harrison passed away on the morning of Jan. 13, 2018, at her home in Chesapeake, VA. She is survived by her husband of 56 years, James, her daughter and son-in-law Kimberly and Barton Greer of Ashburn, Virginia, and three grandsons: Cameron, Garrett and Bryce Greer. She leaves to mourn her passing a sizeable extended family as well as a host of friends and colleagues in the Tidewater/Richmond area, the Delaware/Philadelphia region and throughout Northeast Ohio.

Born July 14, 1938, in Charlottesville, VA, Sylvia displayed academic excellence at an early age, graduating from Jackson P. Burley High School at age 15 and immediately enrolling in Virginia State University. There, she earned a degree in English Education and by age 19 was teaching English in the Norfolk County Public Schools system at Crestwood High. She would go on to teach English in the Norfolk Public Schools system at Lake Taylor High School, retiring in 1998—sort of. Even in retirement, her former vocation kept her busy writing English curricula and approving reading materials for use in the Norfolk school system. Over her 45-year teaching career, she was recognized by peers and students alike for her commitment to education and proficiency in her field.

Sylvia was a member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., and a longtime, active member of St. James Episcopal Church in Portsmouth, VA, where she served in many support and fellowship roles over her four decades as a parishioner there. Well-known and respected for her graceful, compassionate

style, Sylvia was ever-ready with words of support and encouragement or with a kind gesture. She volunteered her time freely in service to her community and to her church and was a constant advocate for literacy and language arts programs. Caring for and nurturing her family was always a top priority for Sylvia and, in her later years, her three grandsons were a source of constant pride and delight for her. Even when her health began to decline, she would not hear of missing a special event or graduation by any one of “her boys.”
